In addition from all categories, twenty-five (25) Honorable Mention certificates and cash or prizes worth of Rs. 5000 will be awarded.

Conditions

- o Maximum of 3 entries, one per theme
- o Size A3 (29.7 x 42.0 cm, or 11.69 x 16.53 inches)
- o Material: Drawing papers, bristol boards, canvas, box board etc. Art work may be drawn in pencil, pen, charcoal, or crayon, or painted in pastel, watercolor, gouache, acrylics, oils, poster color etc.
- o The artwork should be drawn by hand (no digital art work). Collage work accepted
- Certification: Back of the artwork must contain
 - o The theme of the artwork
 - o The student's full name, age, date of birth, grade, school, address, contact phone number/email
 - o The signature/ certification by the Principal, class teacher or art teacher as the original unassisted work of the student with the school seal
- O Please do not write on the front of the artwork
- o Children with special needs may be assisted in their work and the type of assistance given must be described and certified
- The artwork submitted for the competition will not be returned
- o The final decision is with the panel of judges
- o The organizers can use any selected artwork to create posters, placards, publications and in other ways to promote environmental awareness with due credit to the student
